Driving Instructions to

Britain on the Green

April 27, 2008

Collingwood is located in Alexandria, VA, on the river side of the George Washington Parkway, approximately halfway between the Beltway and Mount Vernon. Please be aware that *THE GEORGE WASHINGTON PARKWAY WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FROM 7:00 AM TO APPROXIMATELY 11:00 AM ON SUNDAY, APRIL 27,* the day of BOG. Not to worry! We have alternative routes:

From MD or VA beltway (Points North):

- From the Capital Beltway from MD, take Route 1 South (toward Ft. Belvoir). At first opportunity, turn LEFT, cross over Route 1 onto Huntington Avenue (skip next instruction).
- From the Capital Beltway from VA, exit at Telegraph Road South. Continue STRAIGHT at traffic light onto Huntington Avenue (do not turn onto Telegraph Road). Continue STRAIGHT across Route 1.
- Turn RIGHT onto Ft. Hunt Rd. for about 4 miles, make a left onto Collingwood Road.
- Follow Collingwood Rd. to the GW Parkway. Go straight across the parkway, and Collingwood is on your right.

From Points South:

- Drive North on Route 1 approximately 3 miles further north from the intersection with Mt. Vernon Parkway (Woodlawn).
- Turn RIGHT onto Sherwood Hall Lane.
- In approximately ½ mile, turn RIGHT on Parkers Lane. Parkers Lane turns into Collingwood Road.
- Continue STRAIGHT across Fort Hunt Road to the GW Parkway. Go STRAIGHT across the parkway, and Collingwood is on your right.

We ask that you PLEASE do not arrive before the gates to the show open at 9:30 AM. If you do arrive early and/or if there is a barricade at the Parkway, there are still runners passing. Pull over and be patient. We'll get you across as soon as possible.

Because of continuing construction at the intersection of the Beltway and Route 1, we recommend

that you check our website for updates before the show.
